PTWA Library

Some information about the PTWA Library. There are DVDs as far back as 2006 of demonstrators at the PTWA meetings as well as some DVDs from the many of the Symposiums around the country. There are "How to" DVDs that have been purchased. There will be a list with the library cabinet at the meetings.

As a member of the club you can rent DVDs as follows:

These are very reasonable prices since you have the whole month to look at the DVD. For new members, there are some very good DVDs to help you get started.

Minutes - July 12, 2022, PTWA Meeting

Geoff Purser opened the meeting at the Leonard Center at 6:30. He welcomed a new member and a visitor. He announced that Bob Moffett will be Turner of the Month for August, and that Lan Brady will be doing the evening demo. Upcoming classes being taught by PTWA members were discussed. Bob Schasse gave the Treasurer's report and described the items for sale in the Club store. We will resume collecting dues in 2023.

The Gallery followed, with a broad variety of items made by members. A number of items represented this month's theme – "Use of Color". Next month's theme will be "A turned item from something other than wood".


The Gallery was followed by a break, and then the raffle.

Lan Brady's demo was on "Needle Cases". This was an important item years ago when needles were very precious and expensive. Now the cases are used for toothpicks, pills, and a convenient way to give grandchildren money, etc. Lan has developed a criteria for the cases he makes. They must accept rolled currency, be easy to open with one hand, the lid must be tight enough to stay in place, and the wood must be tough enough to withstand repeated opening without the lid becoming loose. (The demo case was mahogany.) He showed a template he developed to facilitate laying out the blank. He does these in production batches, with a case in fifteen minutes.

He turns the blank to the desired diameter, then parts off the body. He then drills a 5/8" diameter hole in the lid portion. The body gets a ½" diameter hole. You must pay attention to depth in both cases to avoid breaking through during finishing. He turns a relief at the joint to facilitate one-hand removal, and places decorative grooves on both parts, including one at the joint. The contact at the joint has a slight crown in the middle, to ensure a slight locking fit. These are done with a beading tool, followed by a burn wire. Lan noted that he now uses the wire and handles used in windshield installation with good results. When parting the body, he holds the tool at a slight angle so the case will stand up on its base. He puts a radial crown on the lid. Finishing is done with progressively finer sanding, and he prefers a lacquer finish.

FROM WEST OF GREENSBORO

Take I-40 East to Exit 212 (Bus-40 Greensboro to Bryan Blvd). Exit is from the right lane.

At the top of the Exit 212 ramp take Exit 24 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.

Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.

Go about ¼ mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.

As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come to the intersection of Ballinger Rd.

Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left.

FROM EAST OF GREENSBORO

Take Bus-40 through Greensboro

Take Exit 212 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.

Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.

Go about 1/4 mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.

As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come the intersection of Ballinger Rd.

Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left.

FROM THE NORTH SIDE OF GREENSBORO *Note: Ballinger Rd. is now open.* Ballinger turns west from New Garden / Guilford College Rd. just north of Guilford College. The following link to MapQuest will detail this area. Directions from Bus-40 to Guilford College Rd have been removed since the above directions are much faster from Bus-40.
