Intro to Paul Hannaby by Jim Duxbury

Paul Hannaby is a Registered Professional Woodturner, tutor, and author from the Forest of Dean, Gloucestershire, England. He is the president of the AWGB, Association of Woodturners Great Britain, similar to our AAW.

He produces a wide range of turned items mainly from local timber but also incorporates other materials such as stone, metals, resin and paint which are intended to enhance the beauty of the wood. Much of Paul's main focus in woodturning is on individual one off pieces. He also likes to use a variety of different tools and techniques, combining texture and colour with turning wood to enhance the natural beauty of the wood.

Paul also produces utility items such as salad bowls, pepper/salt grinders, chopping boards, clocks and pens. Many more examples of Paul's woodturning can be seen on [Paul's Creative Woodturning](#) website. Paul will demonstrate techniques while turning a natural edge goblet and a twisted stem goblet. Remember the UK is 5 hours ahead of our time so 7:00PM is midnight for him. This demo will go from midnight to 2:00AM UK time. He is a great guy, first class woodturner, very knowledgeable, fun to listen to, and when this is over you may understand English. I just "learnt" that.
